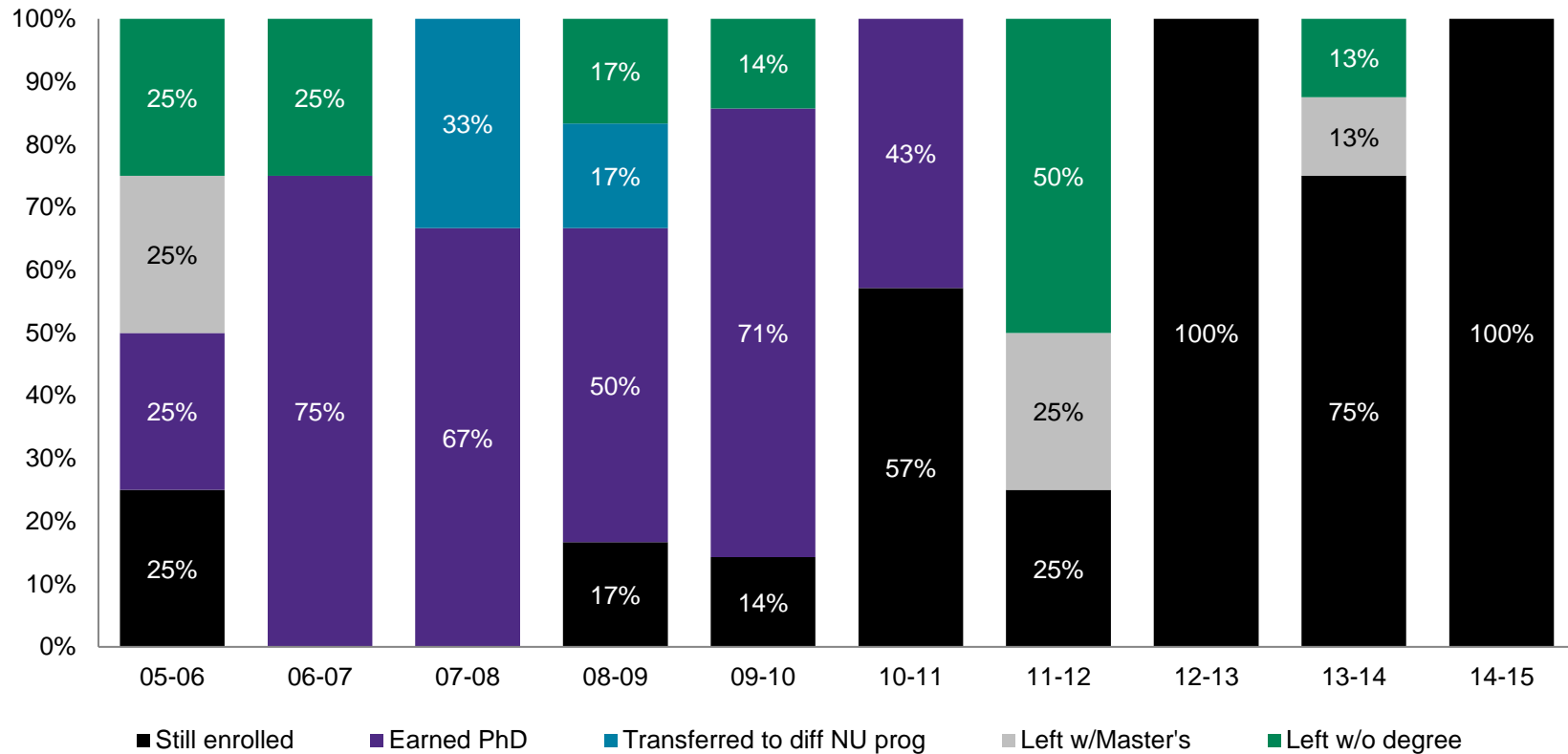

PhD program in Communication Sciences & Disorders was created in fall of 2002

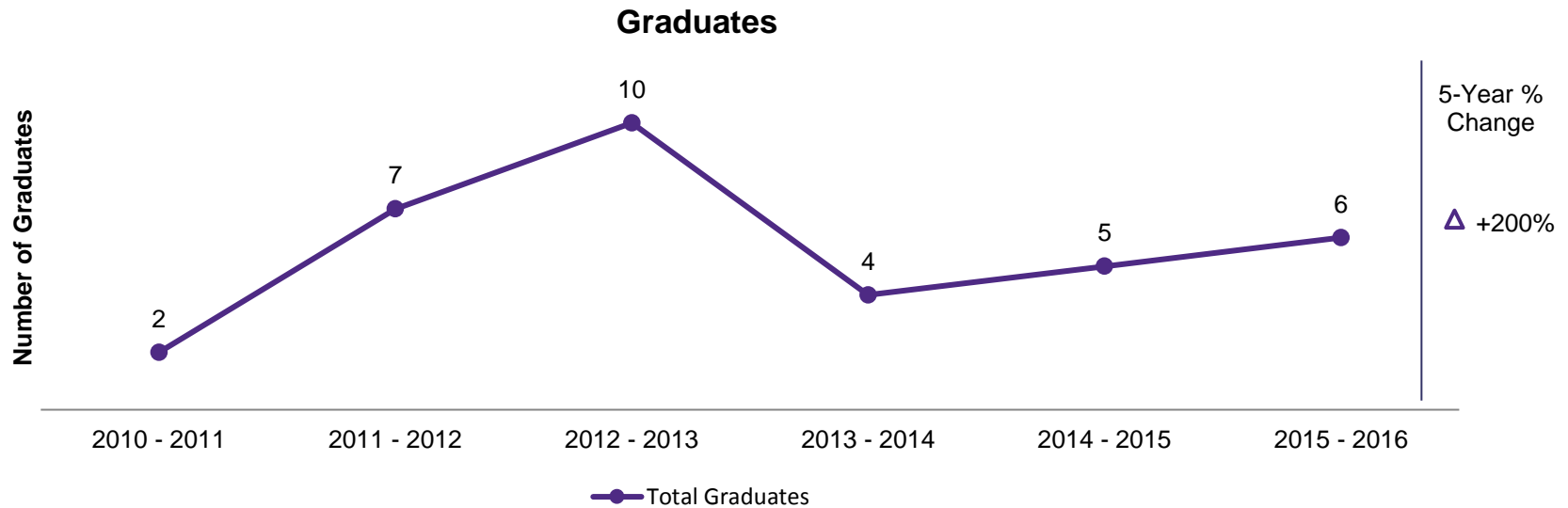
