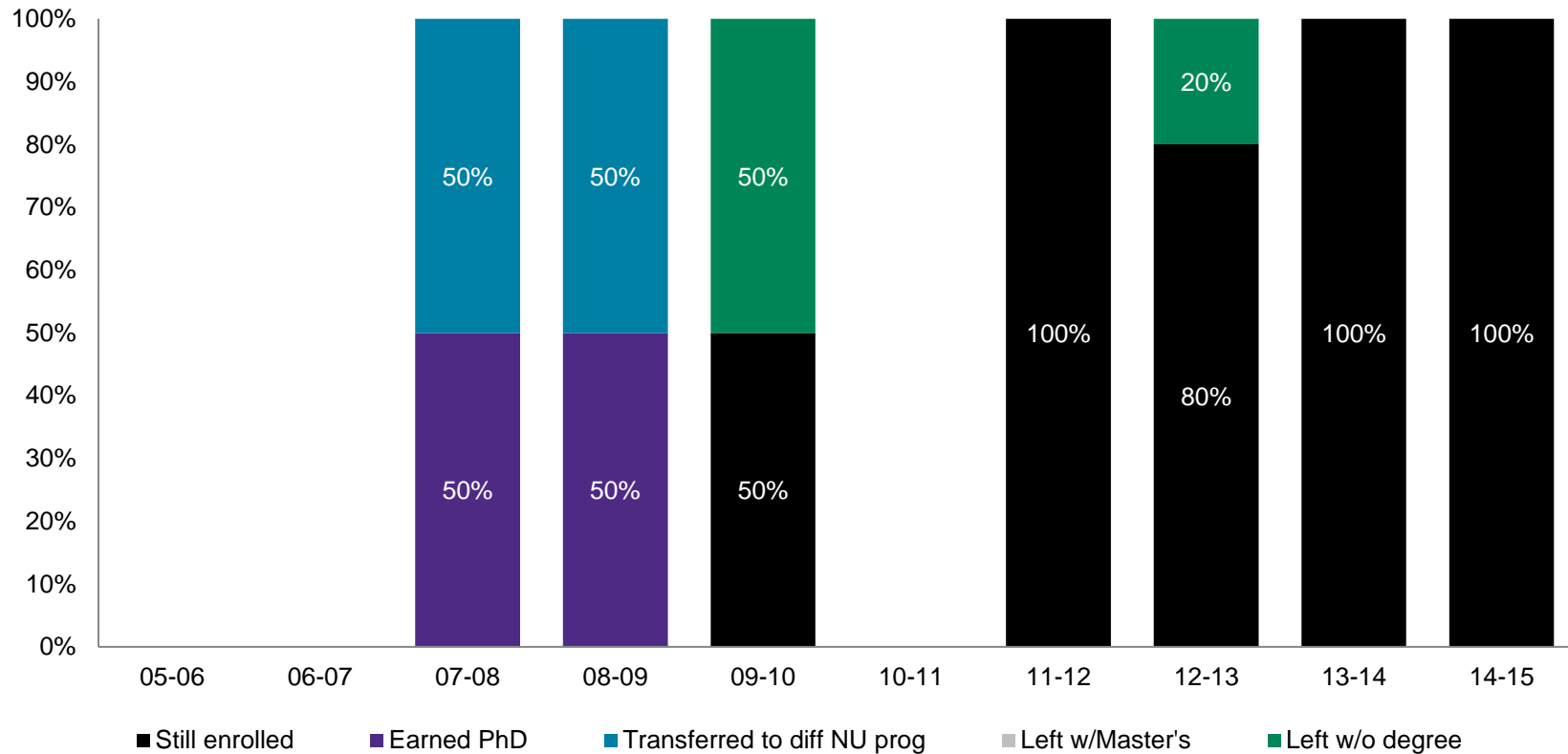

PhD program in Technology & Social Behavior was created in fall of 2007

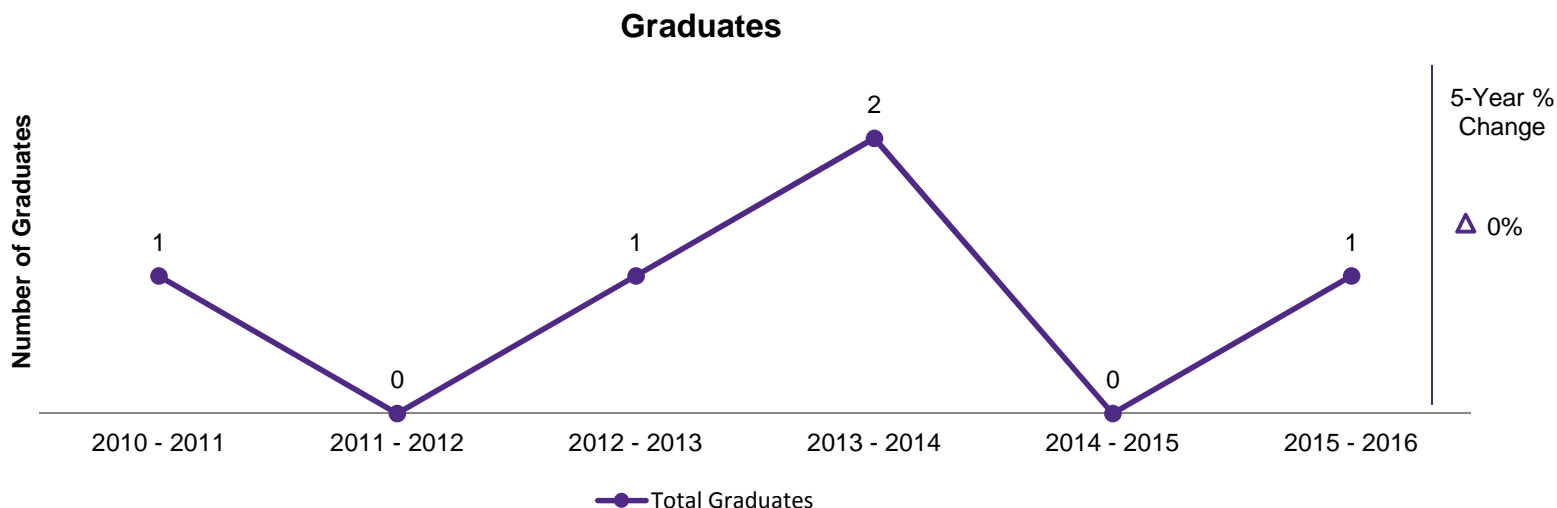
